Currently, Ukuwela is gearing up for 2025 and has received twelve nominations of candidates to participate in the employment component of the program. These learners have been assessed and we are hard at work mapping resources to connect them to potential opportunities.

Taking stock of the year's activities we stand amazed at what was accomplished!

A total of 114 attendances were recorded of learners who participated in work exposure at six different workplaces representing five different industries. In addition to work exposure, we clocked 74 attendances of learners participating in skills training short courses conducted by accredited training providers. These include Basic Housekeeping, Room Attendant, Home Veggie Garden and Leg, Foot and Scalp

massage training.
